As work on the foundations began on the Penn Villa townhomes in Sellersville, one of the volunteers commented, "This is like playing with Legos," as they snapped the Insulated Concrete Forms (ICFs) into place. Construction Director Mike Fallon said, "Using ICFs is a very safe, volunteer-friendly, efficient process for laying our foundations." These blocks, made from 97 percent recycled materials, are environmentally friendly and strong. Off to a great start in October, work has been progressing smoothly through the winter on the first five houses, with framing and roofing nearing completion. Construction will continue through the summer with a fall dedication planned for these homes.

Volunteers, thank you for all the great work you have done this winter, on some very cold days, to keep things moving along on the townhomes!

Future homeowners, Ligia and Eduardo Huertas, have been working alongside volunteers in raising walls. "[Partnering with Habitat] means we are more busy, tired and ready for challenges," Ligia shared. "And, it means we are going to be equal to everybody...and be homeowners, too."


A Brush with Kindness News
