As we enter our 35th year, we can't help but look back at our humble beginnings in a church basement and reflect on how far we've come:

- 130 homes have been constructed, changing the lives of 490 individuals, including 273 children.
- Since 2011, 298 home repairs have been completed, making homes safe and more accessible for homeowners.
- Almost Home, our financial empowerment program, has educated 385 participants, resulting in their elimination of \$154,000 of debt and increased savings of over \$258,000 since the program's launch in 2016.
- More than 118,000 hours have been donated by 4,500 volunteers, just since 2019.

## **Ensuring the health and safety of Bucks County families**

Frances came to the United States at the age of 20, married, and started a family. After three children, however, her husband decided he wasn't cut out to be a husband and father, leaving her to raise and support the children on her own. She started a daycare and, after all her children were in school, worked full-time in real estate and then sales. At 77, with her savings, Social Security, and a frugal mindset, she finally decided it was time to retire.

She wasn't expecting her boiler to fail.

"One day, there was just no hot water. I'm thinking I can have it repaired, but then there wouldn't be much of anything left."

Never one to ask for help, she finally decided to contact area resources. She was referred to Habitat Bucks through a local representative's office. The Home Repair team was prepared to step in.


"There's a lot of memories here. This really is home. It's more of a home than I've ever had.

# Changing lives one house at a time

Christian works hard at her job but she's dedicated to "being a mom, first." Having grown up without a long-term place to call home, she recognized that her children needed more space to grow and thrive and that her two-bedroom apartment was limiting that growth. She heard about Habitat Bucks accepting applications for one of five Habitat homes and "speedily jumped on the opportunity, which I am very grateful for – to be able to be part of such a great opportunity with and for my family."

Christian shared, "I cannot express how exciting and amazing this whole process is and has been. The Habitat Family has been absolutely wonderful in helping me purchase an affordable home to move myself and my children out of a small apartment into a home where we can grow and build. They have walked with and taught me through this entire process. From physically assisting me with the building of my home to the ins and outs of mortgages and taxes and insurance. Habitat is a blessing and I am tremendously grateful to partner with them."



## Who buys our homes

A family of four has an annual income of \$60,790. They currently spend more than 30% of their income on rent, leaving them little for food, healthcare, etc. They are housing cost burdened. Based on their income and mortgage, taxes, and other housing costs, they can afford a \$182,370 home, but finding one they can afford is a challenge.

We partner with low-income buyers to purchase a home without being cost burdened. An attainable home provides an asset that increases stability and generation wealth building and improves education and health outcomes for the owners and their families.
